## 11 of 17 Counties Had Population Growth Since Pre-Recession; Clark, Washoe and Elko Lead the Way

- This Research Note examines population growth/decline in the Silver State from 2007 to 2016. The most recent U.S. Census Bureau estimates show Nevada's population at 2.9 million in 2016, up from 2.6 million in 2007, an increase of about 340,000. At the county level, 11 of 17 counties have realized increases in population from 2007 to 2016.
- Clark County had the highest population growth with about 288,000 new residents, followed by Washoe County and Elko, with gains of 45,000 and 4,800, respectively.
- Nye County had the highest population decline at about 900 residents, followed by Churchill County, with close to 800, and Carson City with over 500.
- In 2016 alone, ten counties experienced year-over-year population growth relative to the prior year. Clark County's population growth in 2016 of 46,400 reflects a natural increase (births minus deaths) of about 11,000.
  It also reflects a net migration of 34,300 people moving into the county, about 80% of whom were domestic in-migrants from elsewhere in the U.S.
- During the same period, Washoe County shows a natural increase of 1,700 and a net migration of 6,300 (90% were domestic in-migrants from other states). All told, the County's population grew 8,200 over the 2015-2016 period.
