

Twenty One Percent of 2016 NDE Graduates Enroll in STEM Programs at NSHE Institutions



- Using NPWR's¹ Summary of Continuation for Nevada 2016 High School Graduates report, we looked at the percentage Nevada Department of Education (NDE) high school graduates who continued to Nevada System of Higher Education (NSHE) institutions, with a breakout for whether those grads entered into STEM majors.
- According to this report, 46 percent of NDE graduates continued to NSHE institutions. The balance, 55 percent² of NDE graduates, either continued outside of NSHE institutions or did not continue after high school.
- Within those 46 percent of NDE graduates who continued to NSHE institutions, a segment of 21 percent entered into STEM majors.
- That 21 percent is further broken down, indicating that ten percent of NDE graduates entered into a STEM major at the community college level, whereas eleven percent of NDE graduates did so at fouryear institutions.
